

Legal Advice

Neighborhood Legal Clinic offers free 30-minute legal consultations on civil legal issues to residents and clients with cases filed in King County. Clinics are operating via phone and Zoom until further notice. To request an appointment, fill out a Client Intake Form at kcba.org/nlc. If you cannot access the online form, call 206-267-7070 and press 1 to leave a message with your name, number, and a brief description of your legal issue. A volunteer will then return your call. Response times vary based on appointment demand and submitting an appointment request does not guarantee an appointment. Note that NLC schedulers' phone numbers often show up as "restricted" on Caller ID.

LYFT Ride Information for Vashon

Individuals seeking transportation can call King County 2-1-1 and confirm with a specialist that they have a transportation need. The specialist will ask some basic screening questions and then connect a dispatcher to confirm eligibility and dispatch a ride for immediate or future use. Currently, this United Way program is able to provide eligible clients with up to two rides of \$22 each way. Clients needing transportation to a COVID-19 vaccine appointment may be eligible for additional rides.

Bluebird Update

Our generous volunteers make it possible for the Center to continue to offer rides for seniors to medical appointments off island in Seattle and Tacoma. Rides are dependent on the availability of our Bluebird drivers, and we ask for a minimum of one week's notice.

Per the Center's COVID-19 policy, we require that Bluebird drivers and riders be fully vaccinated two weeks in advance of their ride. Verification will be required by the driver at the time of service. Please have your vaccination card ready to show the Bluebird driver at pickup.

Drivers and riders must wear an N95 or KN95 mask at all times. We can provide one if you need it.
